COVID-19 Vaccination in Nara City

COVID-19 vaccinations have begun in various regions with the aim of controlling the COVID-19 outbreaks that are raging through Japan.

In Nara City, in cooperation with the City Medical Association, we are proceeding with vaccinations toward the aim of completing vaccinations for the elderly by the end of July.

We will provide you with the latest information to help you with the vaccination process, such as precautions before vaccinations and how to book them.

Approximately 110,000 elderly people can have both vaccinations by the end of July.

Approximately 220,000 vaccines from the Japanese government will be supplied to Nara City by the end of June. As a result, it will be possible for approximately 110,000 elderly people over 65 years of age to receive both vaccinations by the end of July. Vaccines will be distributed to each vaccination venue and to individual medical institutions as soon as they arrive each week.

The number of vaccinations were secured with the cooperation of the city medical association and private facilities.

In addition to 3 venues (Hotel Nikko Nara, Seibu Community Center, and Mi Nara), Nara City Hall will also be a vaccination site daily from May 21.

The shopping center Mi Nara also carries out vaccinations 5 days a week. (Approximately 97,000 doses will be given at these 4 venues by the end of July).

The number of vaccinations for approximately 110,000 people will be guaranteed, including individual vaccinations at each medical institution.


2. Those between 70 and 74 years old (Those who become over 70 in fiscal 2021)

(Those who were born before April 1st, 1952)→From the beginning of June

3. Those between 65 and 69 years old (Those who become over 65 in fiscal 2021)

(Those who were born before April 1st, 1957)→Planning from the end of June (after 2)

4. Those between 16 and 64 years old→From July

You can get the second vaccination at the same venue, at the same time of the same weekday after three weeks in principle.

If you choose to have an "individual vaccination", please confirm the appointment at the medical facility or clinic you went to.

Q&A about COVID-19 Vaccinations

Before vaccinations

- Q. Can I have a vaccination if I have an underlying chronic disease of the respiratory organs or heart trouble?
- A. Please consult your family doctor first.
- Q. Can I get vaccinations during pregnancy and lactation?
- A. Both are possible, but please consult your family doctor if you are worried.
- Q. Can I get a vaccination even if I have a fever?
- A. Those who have a temperature over 37.5 degrees on the appointment day are impossible to be vaccinated.
- Q. Can I get the vaccination while taking medicine?
- A. Basically, it is possible, but please consult your family doctor if you are worried and don't know the details of your medicine.
- Q. Can children get vaccinations?
- A. Pfizer vaccine for people under 16 are now under consideration as May 13.

Vaccination Reservations and Procedure

- Q. Can I change or chancel the date and place?
- A. In principle, we don't accept any changes or cancelations for reservations at the call center. You can change or cancel on your vaccine reservation confirmation page on the website.
- Q. The call center is busy, and I can't get through.
- A. It is difficult due to many calls. Please try to use the Nara City website for your reservation for a group vaccination.
- Q. I don't have a Nara City residence certificate, but I live in Nara City. May I have a vaccination?
- A. In principle, people get vaccinated in the areas where they are registered as residents. However, it will be possible for people with some reasons to get vaccinated after you receive your ticket and follow the procedures*.

Two Ways to Apply for Vaccinations in Nara City for people who have a registered home address outside of Nara City.

No.1: Please apply through the website "COVID-19 Vaccine Navi." of the Ministry of Health, Labor and Welfare.

No.2: Please send an application form* for "Vaccination at no residential areas", a copy of your vaccination ticket, and a stamped return envelope to the Promotion Division for COVID-19 Vaccinations (13-1 Sanjo Honmachi, 630-8122). *The application form can be downloaded through the Nara City website or ask the call center.

When you receive a confirmation sheet for your application after finishing procedure No. 1 or No.2, please bring it to the place of vaccination.

Vaccination Tickets

- Q. I have registered my residency in Nara City, but currently I live outside the city. Can I ask you to send the ticket there?
- A. No. The ticket will be sent only to your registered address in Nara City.
- Q. Can I have my vaccination ticket reissued?
 - *Because I have lost the ticket.
 - *I received the 1st vaccination, but I lost the ticket with the stamp which showed I received the 1st vaccination.
 - *I made a mistake in writing, or I made the card dirty.
- A. In the above cases you can have a new one. So, please call the COVID-19 Call Center.

Group Vaccination Venues

- Q. My parent is very old and/or has a disability. Can carers accompany him/her?
- A. Yes. They can help him/her at the venue after hand-sanitizing and temperature checking. However, please limit the number of carers to avoid congestion.
- Q. Are babysitters available at the venue?
- A. No, they are not.
- Q. Can I take my child or pet to the venue?
- A. No. In order to avoid congestion, please come by yourself with the ticket.

Effects of Vaccination

- Q. How long will the vaccine's immunity last?
- A. It is not clear.
- Q. After vaccination, will I never become infected?
- A. You could become infected even after vaccination. However, it is expected that the vaccination will make an infection mild.
- Q. Can I take the coronavirus vaccination together with other ones, such as for influenza?
- A. No, you should not take them at the same time. After being vaccinated, you have to wait two weeks to receive another kind of inoculation.
- Q. I have a fever at home after the vaccination. What should I do?
- A. If you feel like you are having side effects (or feel sick), please call the medical clinic where you got vaccinated or the Nara Prefectural Side Effect Call Center.



Q. Will the vaccination be effective on other variants?

A. It is reported that Pfizer's vaccine has produced antibodies against other variants.

WHAT IS DV (DOMESTIC VIOLENCE)?

Domestic violence is a coercive pattern of behavior used by one person to control another in an intimate relationship. It is a serious violence to human rights and includes criminal acts. To hurt a partner's body and mind and threaten their safety and security is all violence, without exception.

Psychological Violence

Ignoring someone, yelling, saying hurtful or threatening thing, such as "I'll die if I break up with you" and shifting responsibility.

Economic Violence

The abuser doesn't return borrowed money and makes you give out money. He/she doesn't give you living expenses.

Social Violence

Binding you. Keeping watch on your mobile phone and e-mails.

Sexual Violence

The abuser forces you to perform sexual acts and/or refuses to use contraception.

Physical Violence

Hitting, kicking or choking you.

Violence by Using Children

Threatening you by saying they will have your children taken away. Speaking ill of you to your children.

Domestic violence in front of children also seriously affects their growth, both mentally and physically.

Children who witness domestic violence are often seriously traumatized.

If you feel anxious and nervous when you are with your spouse, it might be domestic violence.

Escape from A Sudden Attack of Ticks During Field Activities

If bitten: There might be symptoms such as a fever, a feeling of physical tiredness, vomiting and rarely a mental disorder from five to fourteen days later after being bitten. There is no effective vaccine so far. Please don't take care of it by yourself; see a surgeon or a specialist in dermatology soon.

Measures for prevention:

- 1. Wear clothes such as long sleeved shirts, long pants with their bottoms tucked into long boots, and cotton gloves for field activities.
- 2. Use insect repellent containing DEET.
- 3. Check whether there are ticks on clothes or your body after field activities and wash or clean them off.
- 4. Brush your pets after walking and use acaricides effectively.

Pregnant women; those who had stomach, lung or intestine surgery or are in treatment; those who have barium sensitivity or had aspiration (lung cancer examination is possible); and those who had an endoscope stomach cancer check by Nara City in the previous fiscal year (lung cancer examination is possible) are excluded.

Others: For those who are breastfeeding, please notify us of such when you apply. The examination interval is once a year. Those might be cases when you may not be able to take the examination depending on your health or questionnaire.

Recommendation for Using Generic Drugs

The phrase "generic drug" literally means the drug contains the same ingredients and has the same effect as a drug approved of by the Ministry of Health, Labor and Welfare, after the patent of that drug has expired. Generic drugs can be developed in shorter periods compared to new drugs, and is cost-saving in terms of development. Therefore, they can be provided at a lower price. There are some generic drugs which come in different shapes, sizes and flavors so as to be taken easily.

Using generic drugs reduce your medical expenses and leads to regulating overall medical expenses in the nation. Please consider using generic drugs to maintain the current medical insurance system which offers everyone sound medical care.

Heat Stroke Alert Goes Live

What Is a Heat Stroke Alert?

When the risk of heat stroke is expected to be extremely high, prefectural governments will issue a "Heat Stroke Alert" the evening before or early that morning so people can take preventive actions. If an alert is issued, please be proactive and take preventive measures such as turning on air conditioners or refraining from going out.

The Alert Will Be Issued When the WBGT Rises to 33°C and Above.

The WBGT (Wet Bulb Globe Temperature) is a measure of heat intensity incorporating three factors that have a significant effect on the human heat balance: temperature, humidity and radiation.

What Should We Do If There's an Alert?

(1) Don't Go Out. Avoid Heat.

The most effective way to prevent heat stroke is to avoid heat. Make moderate use of air conditioning day and night and keep an appropriate room temperature. Refrain from going out unless necessary.

(2) Reach Out to the Vulnerable.

Elderly people, children, people with medical conditions, obese people, people with disabilities, etc. are at higher risk of heat stroke. If you have a family member or a friend like this, please encourage them to use air conditioning during the night and to stay well hydrated.

(3) Take More Preventive Actions Than Usual.

Drink water frequently before you feel thirsty. The recommended amount of water per day is 1.2 liters. Wear cool clothing.

If you are outdoors and can maintain a proper distance (at least 2 meters), you may remove your face mask.

Preparation for Floods


In recent years sudden torrential rains and typhoons frequently hit local areas. We need to take precautions against strong winds and floods, as well as landslides caused by earthquakes. It is important that each of us should be prepared for disasters to keep damage minimal.

Please always think about evacuation measures!

Confirm the risks your house and its neighboring area faces by looking at the city's hazard map, public map information websites, etc. Plan your evacuation process in advance and discuss fully with your family where and how to evacuate.

Special attention during disaster evacuation

Please cooperate when evacuating to various places to prevent the spread of infection at the evacuation site. "Evacuation" does not mean "going to a shelter" but rather "securing safety".



Prepare the things you should take in an emergency evacuation

Please take sanitary materials, such as face masks, disinfectant, etc. to prevent from the spread of infection in evacuation.

Daily Preparedness


- Make use of the disaster/weather information issued by the Meteorological Agency.
- Prepare emergency food and a bag for use in blackouts or power outages, water stoppages, and evacuation.
- Check the remaining shelf life of each stocked item periodically, rotate the items near the end of their shelf life by using them, and replenish the stockpile with fresh items.

Disaster prevention loudspeaker system

In a disaster, disaster and evacuation information will be broadcast through the outdoor loudspeaker system.

Emergency information email

Nara City can deliver emergency information related to natural disasters such as alerts, warnings, and evacuation orders immediately. Pre-registration is required. To register, please read the QR-code below and send a blank message.





Evacuation information changed as of May 20.

With the revision of the Basic Act on Disaster Countermeasures, the guidelines for evacuation information issued by Nara City have been changed as shown in the table below. In order to make it easier to understand information calling for evacuation, we have abolished "the evacuation advisory" and united it into "an evacuation instruction."

	Guidelines after change	Actions taken by residents
Alert Level 5	Ensuring emergency safety	Life is in danger. Ensure immediate safety.
Alert Level 4	Evacuation instruction	Evacuate everyone from dangerous areas.
Alert Level 3	Evacuation of elderly people and others	Evacuate elderly people and others from
		dangerous areas.

A warning level is a division that provides an intuitive understanding of the risk of a disaster and the evacuation actions to be taken.
